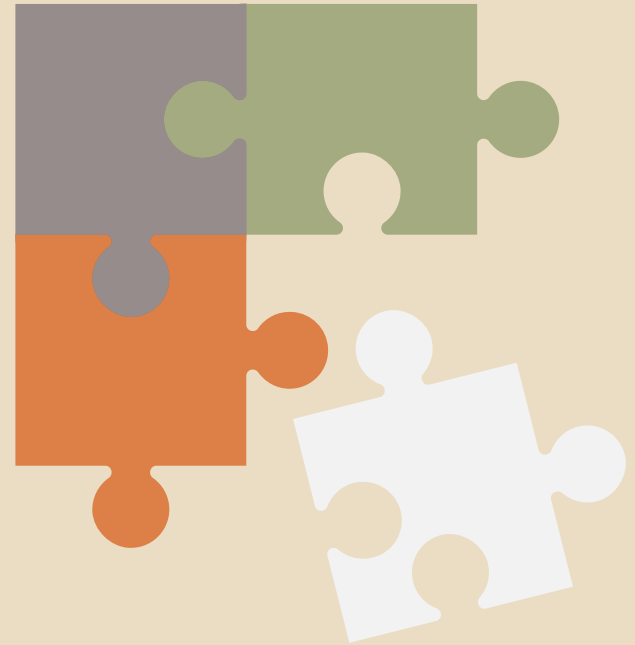

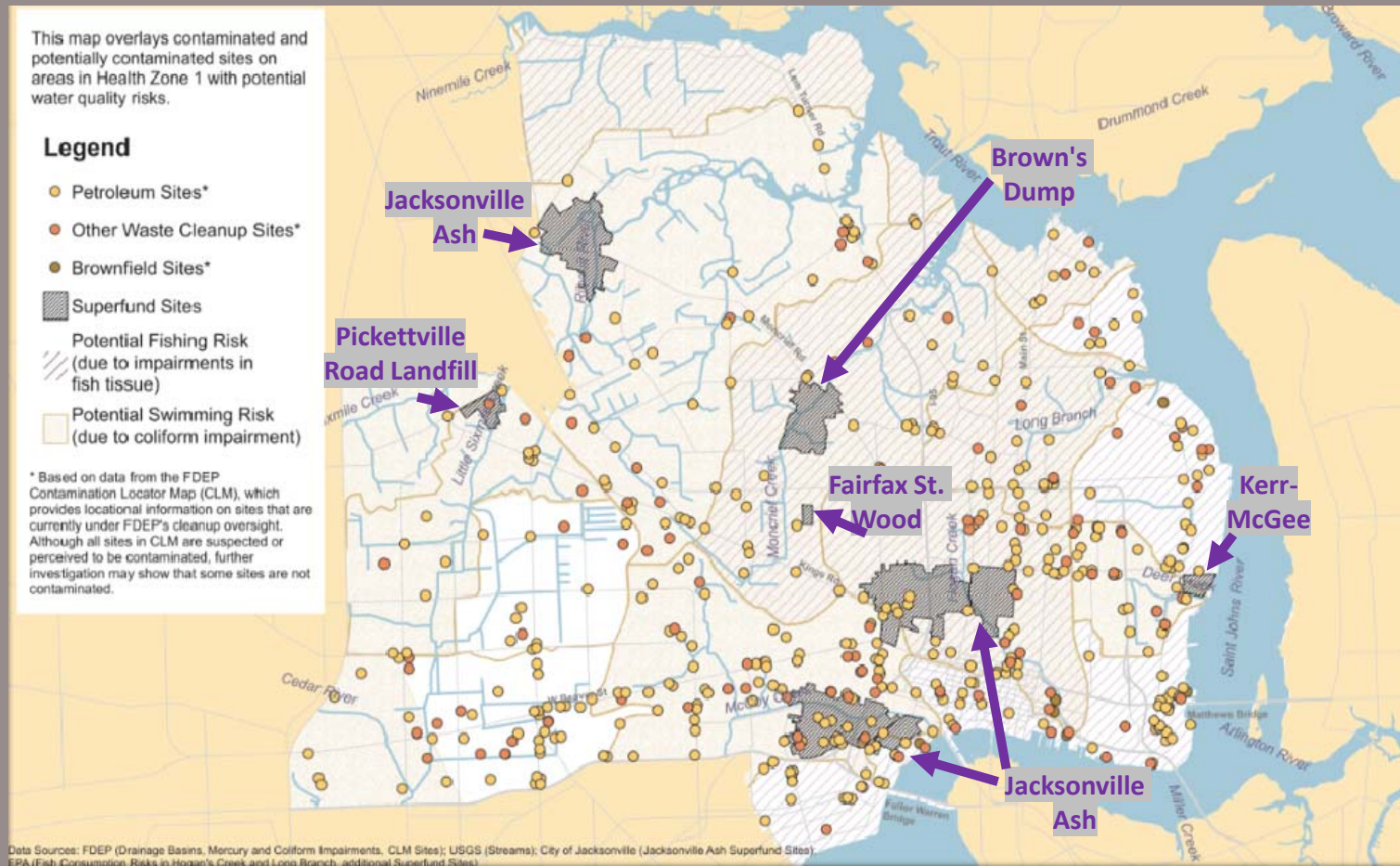
This map overlays contaminated and potentially contaminated sites on areas in Health Zone 1 with potential water quality risks.

* Based on data from the FDEP Contamination Locator Map (CLM), which provides locational information on sites that are currently under FDEP's cleanup oversight. Although all sites in CLM are suspected or perceived to be contaminated, further investigation may show that some sites are not contaminated.

Purpose & Goals:

Improve quality of life through –

- Taking an area-wide approach.
- Building increased stakeholder capacity.
- Integrating quality of life and environmental issues.
- Aligning with existing EPA programs and resources.

Principles:

- Identify community priorities.
- Develop neighborhood-based solutions.
- Strengthen coalition of neighborhoods.
- Prioritize based on community need.
- Evaluate all forms of community capital.
- Build strong "urban villages" and community cores.

Outcomes:

- Built a strong community coalition to drive the revitalization agenda and investment priorities.
- Built a seat at the table and community agenda with City of Jacksonville, and State and Federal Agencies that have resources to help the community.
- **\$30 million** investment by the Local Initiatives Support Corporation to build on the project's successes.
- Recreation facilities at the MaliVai Washington Youth Center and Emmet Reed Community Center.
